GENERAL INFORMATION:

Built along the banks of the Neches River in 1903, the original Beaumont refining facilities have grown into an integrated petrochemical complex that today supports the energy needs of our nation and the world.

ExxonMobil operations in Beaumont span four facilities and approximately 2,700 acres. The refinery, chemical plant and lube plant are located on approximately 2,400 acres near downtown Beaumont. The polyethylene plant, established in 1977, occupies approximately 375 acres west of Beaumont. In 2019, the refinery began construction on its Beaumont Light Atmospheric Distillation Expansion project (BLADE), which will increase crude refining capacity by 65 percent, or 250,000 barrels per day. The project is expected to create 1,850 construction jobs and between 40 and 60 permanent jobs upon completion. In 2019, an expansion at the polyethylene plant was completed, increasing production of high-performance polyethylene by 65 percent, or 650,000 tonnes per year.
