FUTURE LEADERS IN ACTION: HIGH SCHOOL INTERNS SHOWCASE SUMMER ACHIEVEMENTS

In a packed room filled with parents, friends, and community members, each of our 38 high school interns presented their summer projects, sharing both technical skills and personal lessons learned from their experiences. The highly competitive internship program has expanded from six to 38 interns since its inception and now includes high school students and recent graduates from 23 Baton Rouge area high schools. As the program came to a close, the interns sharpened essential soft skills such as networking and personal branding, preparing themselves for future opportunities.



The interns began their summer with onboarding and a STEM field trip to LSU and the Water Institute, where they engaged in hands-on projects exploring mechanical and engineering aspects of the sites. Contractors MMR and Turner Industries welcomed the interns to observe current fabrication projects destined for the Complex. The summer was filled with team-building activities, friendly competitions, and a special visit from former intern and NBA player Damien Jones.

Throughout the summer, interns worked closely with their mentors to prepare for their year-end presentations. They also dedicated time to give back to the community, volunteering with the Greater Baton Rouge Food Bank to assist Houston after Hurricane Beryl and collaborating with Habitat for Humanity Baton Rouge to support affordable housing initiatives.

EMPOWERING TOMORROW'S WORKFORCE

In August, the North Baton Rouge Industrial Training Initiative (NBRITI) program celebrated the graduation of over 90 students certifications who earned from the National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) Core, Level I, and Level II in various disciplines including electrical, pipefitting, millwright, and welding. This marks the 10th graduating class since the program's inception.

NBRITI is a collaborative effort between ExxonMobil and Baton Community College, Rouae offering free training courses in industrial craft fields. Starting in 2024 the program also included training in process technology. Eligible participants receive fast-tracked classroom hands-on training, which also includes life skills and workforce

preparations. The program aims to provide North Baton Rouge residents with opportunities to establish successful careers in skilled trades with local industrial employers. Since its launch in 2012, the program has graduated more than 600 individuals. Applications for the next NBRITI cohort will be available in late spring.
